

WHO IS MY WIFE?

Your wife is the woman who gave you her virginity

Hebrews 13:4 “Marriage is honourable in all, and the bed undefiled: but whoremongers and adulterers God will judge.” Marriage is the union of man with the woman he dis-virgined, (or “humbled” in the King James), whether saved or not – MARRIAGE IS HONOURABLE IN ALL. This is the definite requirement of Christ in the Gospels. And where the situation is irrecoverable – Celibacy.

The truth is, You can NEVER divorce (Matt. 5:32 - Matt. 19:3-9 - Mark. 10:2-12 - Luke. 16:18). When Jesus says divorce is permissible in the case of fornication, he means if the woman is ‘not a virgin’. He is saying you can only divorce if you find out the woman was never your wife in the first place, meaning, she was not a virgin.

We need to know what fornication meant to a Jew, to truly understand the teaching of Jesus. A Jew would divorce a woman if found to be a fornicator = not a virgin (Deut 22:13-21). Jesus confirms this. So he teaches that for any other reason (Deut 24:1, 2) divorce is impossible.

You cannot get a divorce simply because your husband or wife has sex with another, while you are married to him or her. Jesus forbids divorce if she **was** a virgin. Jesus only allows divorce and in fact **requires** divorce when a woman has had sex already, before the man she is now married to. She **cannot** be separated from her first man.

Fornication is marrying ‘a non-virgin’

WHAT IS A VIRGIN?

Only a woman can be a virgin. There is no such thing as a male virgin. 1 Cor. 7:28, 1 Cor 7:36.

HOW DOES MARRIAGE ACTUALLY HAPPEN?

Marriage is not a ceremony. Ceremonies are the commands of men, and have no impact whatsoever on whether marriage takes place at all. For example, a church wedding, bridal clothing, a blessing by a church leader, giving of dowry, public announcements or even civil marriage is not the marriage at all. What ceremony could possibly make the two into one flesh? Matt. 19:5. Marriage only takes place between a man and a virgin at the first time of sex 1 Cor 7:34, 1 Cor. 7:36.

WHAT IS FORNICATION?

Fornication comes from the Greek word “porn-e” which is merely a show to several men, of a woman in sex.

Fornication develops when a WOMAN has sex with more than one man, when both men are still alive.

What about a man having sex with more than one woman in life? Some of the renowned men of the Old Testament took more than one wife, such as King David and King Solomon but **women never had two husbands** because it would be impossible to know the father of the children.

There appears to be instruction in the New Testament to take only one wife. However, it is only directed to bishops and deacons. It is only official rules and Western society which prevents a man from having more than one wife.

Fornication is having 2 husbands, 2 fathers (John 8:41, Deut 23:2)

Fornication (Babylon) is when a woman refuses to submit to her man (obey). This causes spiritual impurity (Num 31 15-18, Judg 21:11). A woman who does not submit to her man will tend to be seductive in her dress and manner.

A woman becomes the wife of a man when she gives her virginity to that man

ADULTERY is marriage to another man’s wife. Once a woman has given her virginity to a man, It is adultery for another man to have sex with her. It is adultery for her to attempt to get married in church to another man. Why? Because Jesus forbids marriage to a non-virgin, it is just like she is a divorced woman.

THE CHURCH CANNOT OVERULE THINGS,

Even if you were an unbeliever, or your girlfriend was an unbeliever at the time ** Marriage is honourable in all **

1 Peter 3:1 Likewise, ye wives, be in subjection to your own husbands; that, if any obey not the word, they also may without the word be won by the conversation of the wives;

1 Corinthians 7:14 For the unbelieving husband is sanctified by the wife, and the unbelieving wife is sanctified by the husband: else were your children unclean; but now are they holy.

Even if a man gets married in church, and yet if he has penetrated a virgin, he is still married to that virgin. The marriage he is now pursuing in church is sinful. However, if he is still with the woman who gave him her virginity, they may get married in church. VIRGINITY=MARRIAGE

I BELIEVE THE TRUTH, BUT WHAT SHOULD I DO NOW?

The answers are not the same from person to person. The man has to do a few things before you can tell him the solution. If he disobeys, then you cannot help him, and you cannot put him in a place of responsibility among believers because he is unreliable.

All parties have to be informed.

If his virgin is an unbeliever, the man must tell her that it does not matter if she does not believe, she can still come back and be his wife, she does not have to become a believer. But he must explain to her that she can only have one husband, the man she gave her virginity to. If she agrees, well.

If she goes, but she later becomes a believer, she has to return as his wife otherwise the Spirit of the Lord cannot remain with her.

What if she is married to another man? The man who presently has the virgin must be told that he has another man's wife. So you need to ask, have the two men spoken? Has he spoken to his virgin and explained to her? Otherwise he is just making excuses to not go after his virgin. There are lots of people who call themselves believers, and yet who disobey. The Lord said, many, I say unto you, will try to enter into the kingdom of God, but cannot.

Before we can know what to do next, we must know whether the people involved are informed. The woman must give up her children to the biological father for them to come under his authority. If a man has paid dowry for a non-virgin he has been robbed. He must give the woman back to her right husband, and see if they agree to get the dowry from the man who took the virginity away. Otherwise, he gives her back to her father and claims dowry refund.

The father can then chase the man who has taken the virginity, and force him to pay, giving him the woman as wife. In all cases, a father maintains authority over his own children because children are conceived by his will (John 1:13) not the woman's will. A man who has taken many virgins may end up very poor this way. If he has not paid for them, he has robbed and must restore, or ask release of the debt from the father of the virgin, or the robbed husband, and take the woman to himself as wife, together with any other children he has from other women.

BUT WHAT IF I HAVE BEEN ABUSED?

You must ask the man, what has he done to mistreat his virgin? Then he must stop mistreating or be refused leadership or position among believers in the living God. A virgin who is mistreated by her husband must remain single. She cannot go and marry another man until her first man is dead, or until he repents from his mistreating and gathers her to himself again.

A virgin who has sex with a family member is ashamed. The family member who humbled her must also bear her shame and take her as his wife, or she remains single. In either case he must do the part of the husband - to provide for her livelihood - house, food, clothes. The man who mistreats his virgin for any reason must be cut off from believers in the living God.

THE ORIGINAL RULES OF MARRIAGE

Abraham was the husband of both Sarah and Hagar. Gen 16:3. Sarah called him lord 1 Pet 3:6. The principles of marriage have not been changed by anyone in the New Testament.

1. Is it true that a person must only have one spouse until death?

Only the woman is bound to one man until he dies. This rule applies to WOMEN only. Not to men. Rom. 7:2,3 and 1 Cor. 7:39. The woman belongs to her first man, unless the first man is dead, then she can marry. Lots of churches make this apply to both men and women. But if we look into the Bible, we find it only applies to women. A non-virgin whose first man is dead is free to marry and *must* marry and have children (1 Tim 5:14).

HOWEVER, a man must stay with his virgin, and cannot abandon her and marry another. He is bound to his virgin, and should not take another woman's virginity. If he does, he will be creating a polygamous life which is not acceptable today. These women will be married to the first man who had sex with them. To have sex with the non-virgins is ADULTERY.

Adultery is when a woman has sex with more than her first man when her first man is still alive. Adultery is not when a man has sex with more than one virgin, if he does not abandon any of them, and they live in the same house. However, this will create problems, for a man to have more than one virgin.

Marriage is not a ceremony. What ceremony could possibly make the two into one flesh? (Matt. 19:5).

2. How is a man guilty of adultery?

Moses received the commandment against adultery directly from God. The law first came from Moses, so it helps to understand what the law says about a woman being your wife by taking her virginity (Exo 22:16, Deut. 22:28-29).

If sex happens between a man and a non-virgin, and the man who took away her virginity is still alive, the relationship is sinful. She belongs to the first man. For her to have sex with any other man is ADULTERY. Also, when any man has sex with her, he commits adultery, even if they get married in church.

Jesus says if a man **divorces** his virgin to marry another, it is ADULTERY.

3. What about rape of a virgin?

If a virgin has been raped, she is bound for life to the man who raped her, until that man dies. Now she has not chosen this, but was forced. The Law of Moses had a solution – the man was to be executed:

Deut 22:25 But if a man find a betrothed damsel in the field, and the man force her, and lie with her: then the man only that lay with her shall die:

26 But unto the damsel thou shalt do nothing; there is in the damsel no sin worthy of death: for **as when a man riseth against his neighbour, and slayeth him, even so is this matter:**

Therefore, the penalty for rape was death. Then the virgin would be free to marry again. Today, however, rape is not punished with death, BUT, according to the Bible it still is a capital offence. There are those borderline cases however, where a woman is seduced, and not raped. In these cases, if a man has sex with more than one virgin, he is the husband of all of them. Commonly, a man who seduces a virgin or even just uses a virgin for sex does not take responsibility for his new wife. But as a virgin, she really is his new wife. God has made them into one flesh, they cannot be separated Matt. 19:5-6. But say he neglects her, for example date-rape of a virgin or one-night stand with a virgin, then he commits adultery every time he has sex with another woman. Because he has neglected his VIRGIN! Malachi 2:14-16.

Unless a man goes back to his virgin and takes her as his own wife, he remains an adulterer for the rest of his life. A man is financially responsible for his virgin for the rest of her life. She becomes his dependent, and to neglect her is to neglect his own flesh and blood. If the virgin decides not to follow him, the virgin must remain single, or she returns back to him again as his wife. Israel killed men to release the women to marry Gen 34:26, Deut 20:13

4. Is there a difference between men and women?

In summary, a woman is made to belong to one man living. Whereas a man can own many virgins, but if he does so, he will create problems. Polygamy is outlawed. A virgin has one hymen (which breaks once, when having sex for the first time, to signify marriage). A man does not have any hymens.

5. Can we get a divorce?

Divorce is only allowed for a man who has a woman who is not really his wife, because she was not his virgin when he took her. Yes you are fornicating with your own 'wife' if she is not your virgin and her first man was still alive when you took her! Divorce is to STOP this fornication and to return her to the rightful husband (John the Baptist, Matthew 14:3,4).

When his virgin has sex with another man or even marries a second man she is an adulteress, but she still is the wife of her first man, even though she divorces him. If she comes back, the man must receive her as his wife. Although she was fornicating, she is no longer fornicating, she is still alive. God has mercy on her soul. King David understood this (2 Sam. 3:13-16).

This principle is the "Command of the Lord". ONLY THE WOMAN is told to remain unmarried after divorce, not the man 1 Cor. 7:10,11. This is because the man could have more than one virgin. But the woman can only have one husband until he dies. Rom. 7:2,3 and 1 Cor. 7:39

6. What if my virgin doesn't love me?

In most cases a man's virgin will love him. But if not, then we may question whether she is really his virgin or not, or if she belongs to another man. If she definitely is his virgin, and yet remains a bad woman, then the man must not go out and get secret lovers. He must rather keep his virgin. If a man has a bad woman and if men are forbidden to marry another virgin, like in Western society today, the man will want to have casual sex with non-virgins, which is fornication. Or he will use pornography which is fornication. If she is his virgin indeed and yet she still is a bad woman, and society forbids him to marry until he first gets a divorce, he will abandon his first virgin for others, and be guilty of adultery. Divorce to virgin is adultery.

7. Is it Adultery for a man to have more than one wife?

In Deut. 21:15 Moses is talking about having two wives AFTER saying "Thou shalt not commit adultery" in Deut 5:18. Therefore having two wives was not adultery in the Old Testament. Consider a captive virgin from the battlefield (Deut 21:11, Num 31:15-18, 35). Also consider the case when a brother has to take the wife of his dead brother (Deut 25:5). Clearly he may already be married, and will be taking more than one wife (Matt. 22:24). This was the way common marriage was practiced for thousands of years.

David was an adulterer with Bathsheba, another man's wife. But before this, he lived with seven women and yet he was no adulterer. God himself gave David his wives (2 Sam 12:8). King David never divorced a woman, and Jesus the son of David was confirming this rule.

Jesus says it is adultery to have another wife only if a man **divorces** – *abandons* his virgin – to marry another (Matt 19:9, Luke 16:18, Mark 10:11).

Let's say a man takes the virginity of several women. All of these virgins are now fornicators according to the rule of virginity unless they remain single. Now the man too is an adulterer because he has abandoned his virgins. A man can have sex with more than one virgin, and become one flesh with several women, even with a harlot 1Cor. 6:16, but this is sin.

8. Doesn't the New Testament teach to be 'Husband of One Wife'?

Common marriage stopped when the Roman Catholic institute forbade it 1 Tim. 4:3 Then other churches began to teach people must have only one wife from Paul 1 Timothy 3:2,12 and Titus 1:6. It was for bishops and deacons.

The ONE WIFE scriptures are for bishops and deacons – *leaders* must have one wife. But why? The context is not about prohibiting sexual pleasure. This is about being a LEADER. In the Greek, *mia* = **first**. Direct Translation: "the husband of FIRST wife (virginity)". A man with a virgin wife allows him to lead a church to be a chaste virgin for Christ (2 Cor 11:2)

9. What about women and widows? Only FEMALE widows exist:

1 Timothy 5:9 Let not a widow be taken into the number under threescore years old, having been the wife of ONE man -- Here a different Greek word is used for ONE - **enos** - which really means "restricted to ONE".

10. Aren't the rules about Men and Women only Tradition?

No. She is created different. It is not about tradition but CREATION. She is created that way since she came from ADAM. The spirit of fornication manifests when the woman seeks equal standing with the man. She is not to have more than one man living. She commits fornication when she seeks to be separated from her first man and tries to have another husband. **WO-MAN**

1. Created in the **image** of the man **1 Cor 11:7**
2. Created **from** the man **1 Cor 11:8**
3. Created **for** the man **1 Cor 11:9** to keep the home **1 Tim 5:14, Titus 2:5**
4. Created **after** the man **1 Tim 2:13**
5. She was the first one to **sin** and led the man into sin **1 Tim 2:14**
6. She is **saved** through man in childbearing (not contraception) **1 Tim 2:15**
7. She is now in **subjection** to the man **1 Cor 14:34, 1 Pet 3:5**
8. And She **must not teach** the man **1 Tim 2:12** nor speak over men in church **1 Cor 14:35** but to ask questions from the man she gave her virginity to, privately and obey. She can speak under God's inspiration publically in Church only with a head covering (1 Cor 11:5-6, Acts 21:9).

The spirit of fornication first manifested when Eve taught Adam to eat. The bible however teaches men to love their wives as the weaker vessel and equal heir of a world where there will be no marriage (1 Pet 3:7, Gal 3:28). To act in fear, not to force the wife, not to command her, but to ask her, like Jesus Christ asks us to obey. These Scriptures talk about fornication: Mat 15:19, Ac 21:25, Rom 1:29, 1 Cor 7:2, 1 Cor 10:8, 2 Cor 12:21, Gal 5:19, Eph 5:3, Col 3:5, 1 Thes 4:3, Heb 12:16, Jude 1:7, Rev 9:21

FINAL WARNING

When a person commits murder and he is born again, he is forgiven, but the people are still dead. It is the same with virginity. **A woman may have killed herself by fornicating the first time. A man may have destroyed the children conceived with a non-virgin woman.** We cannot offer them a church wedding. Marriage is only possible by VIRGINITY, then FATHER CONSENT. Children alone do not make a marriage. Elders must instruct the youth.
